## Community Standards Bylaw Policy Review

The City is developing a Community Standards Bylaw (CSB). The CSB will serve to regulate and enable activities that pertain to the safety, health, and welfare of residents on private and public property.

**TOPIC NAME:** Urination and Defecation/Human Waste (NEW)

## 1. CURRENT SPRUCE GROVE BYLAW

Spruce Grove does not currently have a bylaw on public urination and defecation/human waste.

## 2. SPRUCE GROVE CONTEXT

Incidence of public urination has increased.

#### 3. OTHER JURISDICTIONS

#### Edmonton

• A person shall not urinate or defecate in a public place except in a facility designed and intended for such use (<u>Edmonton Public Places Bylaw</u>, s.5)

## **Beaumont**

 A Person shall not urinate or defecate in a Public Place or on Property except in a facility designated and intended for such use (<u>Beaumont CSB</u>, s. 6)

## **Strathcona County**

• No Person shall urinate or defecate in a Park except in a facility designed for such use (Strathcona County Public Parks Bylaw s.7.3)

#### St. Albert

No bylaw.

#### 4. ADMINISTRATION'S RECOMMENDATIONS

The recommended minimum standard is what is listed in Beaumont's CSB.

# **Other Recommendations**

Administration recommends including a section on public urination/defecation in the CSB. This behaviour is generally viewed as unacceptable by the vast majority of the public.
