

TOWN OF SPRUCE GROVE

BY-LAW NO. 602-81

MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT

Being a by-law of the Town of Spruce Grove in the Province of Alberta providing for the entering into of a peace-time disaster mutual aid agreement with adjacent municipalities.

WHEREAS the County of Parkland, the Towns of Stony Plain and Drayton Valley, the Villages of Entwistle and Wabamum, and the Summer Village of Seba Beach, have agreed to enter into a peace-time disaster mutual aid agreement;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Town of Spruce Grove deem it advisable and expedient to enter into said agreement;

AND WHEREAS Section 118 of the Municipal Government Act, being Chapter 246 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1970, with amendments thereto, authorizes the Council of the Town of Spruce Grove to enter into agreement with other Municipalities;

NOW THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SPRUCE GROVE, DULY ASSEMBLED, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the Town of Spruce Grove, together with the County of Parkland, the Towns of Stony Plain and Drayton Valley, the Villages of Entwistle and Wabamum, and the Summer Village of Seba Beach, enter into a peace-time disaster mutual aid agreement, which is attached hereto and forming part of this by-law, and hereinafter referred to as Schedule "A".

2. That Schedule "A" may be modified by resolution, providing mutual consent in writing is received by all parties in said agreement.

3. That the Mayor and Municipal Secretary are hereby authorized and empowered to execute said agreement under appropriate seal of the Town of Spruce Grove.

4. The final passing of this by-law shall rescind By-law No. 347.



MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT

SCHEDULE A

PEACETIME EMERGENCY MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT

BETWEEN the incorporated municipalities listed below:

1. County of Parkland #31
2. Town of Stony Plain
3. Town of Spruce Grove
4. Town of Drayton Valley
5. Village of Entwistle
6. Village of Wabamun
7. Summer Village of Seba Beach

WHEREAS a peacetime emergency could affect any municipality to such a degree that local municipal resources would be inadequate to cope with the situation;

AND WHEREAS the above-named municipalities wish to make prearrangements for speedy emergency action in support of any one municipality in the group which may be affected or threatened by peacetime disaster and require assistance;

THEREFORE, the above-named municipalities agree as follows:

1. Any one of the parties to the Agreement, if and when in need of help to combat a peacetime emergency, may request mutual aid from one or more of the other parties subject to the following conditions:
 - a. the request for aid shall be made by an elected official of the municipality concerned, and must be directed to an elected official of the municipality/ies whose assistance is being sought; except that:
 - (1) calls for fire fighting mutual aid may be made by the Fire Chief, or by an elected official, of the municipality concerned;
 - (2) calls for fire fighting mutual aid may be made to the Fire Chief, or to an elected official, of the municipality whose assistance is being sought;
 - (3) any fire fighting mutual aid actions taken by a Fire Chief shall be reported to an elected official as soon as possible;
 - b. requests for mutual aid shall be restricted to municipally-owned equipment and municipal employees, excepting volunteer fire fighters engaged in fire fighting mutual aid;

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THEREFORE, the above-named municipalities agree as follows:

- 1. Any one of the parties to the Agreement, if and when in need of help to combat a peacetime emergency, may request mutual aid from one or more of the other parties subject to the following conditions:
 - a. the request for aid shall be made by an elected official of the municipality concerned, and must be directed to an elected official of the municipality/ies whose assistance is being sought; except that:
 - (1) calls for fire fighting mutual aid may be made by the Fire Chief, or by an elected official, of the municipality concerned;
 - (2) calls for fire fighting mutual aid may be made to the Fire Chief, or to an elected official, of the municipality whose assistance is being sought;
 - (3) any fire fighting mutual aid actions taken by a Fire Chief shall be reported to an elected official as soon as possible;
 - b. requests for mutual aid shall be restricted to municipally-owned equipment and municipal employees, excepting volunteer fire fighters engaged in fire fighting mutual aid;

- c. On receipt of a call for aid--whether general, or specific as to resources required--the extent of the assistance given will be at the discretion of each responding municipality, having regard to its own local situation at the time;
- d. Any cost incurred in connection with the mobilization, movement and deployment of mutual aid resources, will be borne by the municipality/ies receiving the aid;
- e. The municipality affected or threatened by the emergency and calling for mutual aid, shall implement its Peacetime Emergency Operations Plan and--for the duration of the emergency operations--will assume direction and control over equipment and manpower contributed by other parties to this Agreement.

2. This Agreement comes into force on September 1 1981, and shall be reviewed yearly thereafter. At the time of review, changes or additions may be introduced by way of a rider which shall become part of the Agreement upon ratification by all parties.

3. Any one of the participating municipalities may withdraw from the Agreement by giving 60 days' notice of termination to the other parties. After the withdrawal of any party, the Agreement shall continue in force between the remaining parties.
