Background

- 2022 Bill 6 Introduced
 - New Governance Model for RCMP Policing in Alberta
- September 26, 2024 Royal Assent to new RCMP Governance Model
 - March 2025 Implementation
- Municipal Obligations
 - MUST have Committee
 - MAY have a joint committee with Stony Plain
- Bylaw drafted as a Stand Alone Committee



Background

- Police Governance Regulations Role / Function of the Committee
 - Policing Priorities
 - Community Barometer
 - Officer In Charge (OIC) selection process
 - Community Safety Plan
 - No financial authorities or other roles ...
- New Police Regulations (Ministerial) Size and makeup
 - Council Limits
- Evolving discussions ... more changes to come
- Draft Bylaw presented for discussion



Options For Council

- 1 to 2 Council Members, total size 5 to 7 Appointees
- Diversity of Representation requirement
- Both Models Administration has Ex-Officio Role
 - Integration of Community Social Development (CSD) and Protective Services (PS) leads
 - CSD Plan as Community Safety Plan Avoid Duplication



Non-Voting Members

- OIC RCMP Detachment
 - Operational expert and receiving the Input
- Manager Enforcement Services / RCMP Contract Oversight
 - Link to Administration and management of the Contract
- Director of Community and Social Development
 - Community Safety Plan
