WHEREAS The City of Spruce Grove recognizes that we are part of a global society and the actions we take locally can have a positive influence on the world we live in. Our purchasing power can have a positive influence on the local and regional community and economy and support recovery;

AND WHEREAS a policy statement on sustainable procurement would align with the City's fiscal sustainability framework and the 2021-2023 Corporate Plan triple bottom line approach to sustainability;

AND WHEREAS the City of Spruce Grove embraces the following sustainable procurement principles:

- Value for money;
- Enabling opportunities for local business and social enterprise;
- Enabling opportunities for equity, inclusion and diversity;
- Supporting environmental sustainability; and
- Leading by example in procurement practice and governance.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

As a City, we want to ensure that value for money goes beyond cost and integrates social, economic and environmental value and benefit for our community. We are committed to creating positive environmental, social and economic impacts while maintaining open, fair and transparent procurement processes.

AND FURTHER THAT:

The City Manager implement, under the authority given to them under the City Manager's Bylaw, C-1094-19, as amended, a sustainable procurement policy that reflects the above mentioned principles and aspires to the following objectives:

• Recognising that value for money is more than price paid;



- Enabling opportunities for the local business community to increase their capacity and capability to become suppliers to the City;
- Enabling opportunities for local businesses and social enterprises, such as community and not-for-profit organizations to create capacity for local job seekers, especially those who are marginalised, disadvantaged and under-represented in the work force;
- Working to reduce our impact on the environment by encouraging and where possible adopting thoughtful purchasing behaviours;
- Focusing on the triple bottom line in procurement which incorporates social, economic, and environmental considerations that can be measured, evaluated and reported on;
- Leading in procurement governance practices of integrity, fairness and transparency and openness while building organisational capability and expertise;
- Working toward achieving equity, diversity and inclusion outcomes in our procurement practices; and
- Aiming for continuous improvement in purchasing practices.
