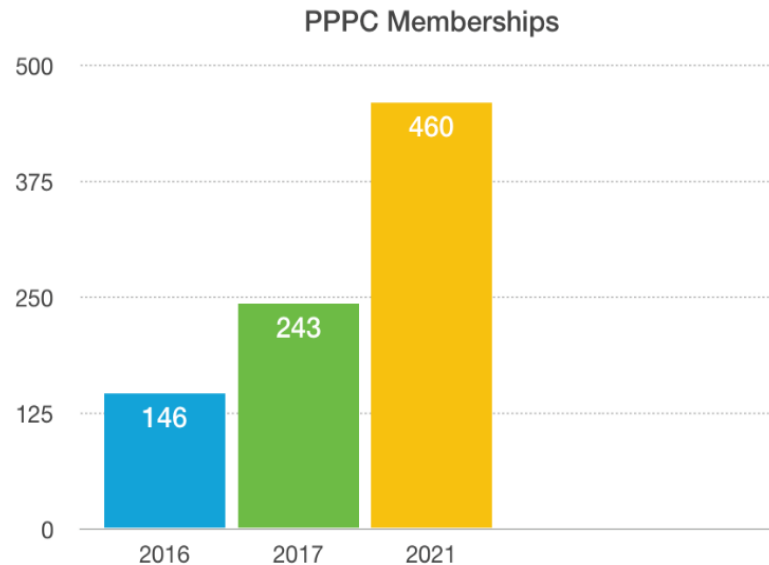


Parkland Pickleheads Pickleball Club (PPPC)

- Born in 2012 and incorporated 2014 as a Non Profit Society.



- 2017 – 12 new courts on former Tennis Courts. City of Spruce Grove \$100,000.00 and PPPC \$104,000.00. (Club Fundraising and CFEP grant).



Pride of Membership

- Our Club is well organized and managed. The work that we accomplish in a City owned facility, to ensure everyone enjoys the game could not be done without our strong membership and their volunteer hours.
- Court Maintenance – 193 hours (includes court washing, lawn maintenance, wind screen maintenance & repairs, cleaning of donated bathroom facilities)
- Community Volunteer Hours – 298+ (Stony Plain Farmers Day, SG Canada Day)
- Club Related - 1959 + hours
- Medical Training and First Aid – 58 hours
- Tournaments – 975 + hours (these hours reflect the 5 tournaments held in 2021, including Provincials.
- Executive and Committee Volunteer – 1080+ hours



- Today, we currently have 460 Members, making us #4 in the Province!
- 10 years of age to 82 years of age. (48% Female/52% Male. Please note we do not have statistics available to us regarding Public use).
- Pickleball is an inclusive and affordable sport for everyone.
- Fastest growing sport in North America with 4.5 Million Players!
- With the uptake in popularity and demand of this sport, court time becomes very valuable, thus increases the need for more surfaces to play on. Medicine Hat 20 Courts with 201 Members. Red Deer 20 courts, plus 4 more coming for 397 Members.



More Courts = More Opportunities

- Red Deer hosted the Canadian National Championships this past August. Over 800 Players registered from across Canada. Economic impact - \$1,134,555.00 to the City of Red Deer!
- January to April 2022 – Applications Opportunity to Host 2023 Nationals, Western Regionals or an Open Championship Tournament.
- PPC will bring to the table - \$350,000.00 for Sport Court Surface, Fencing, Spectator Seating and Windscreens. Future Phases include Washroom Facilities and Court Lighting. This will occur through ongoing Fundraising and Sponsorship opportunities.



Our Ask to the City of Spruce Grove

- To create a partnership between the City of Spruce Grove and the PPPC, to construct 12 Additional Courts including 2 Championship Courts.
 1. Approval of Project.
 2. Engineering Services.
 3. Project Management.
 4. Pre-Construction Preparation of the Site – ready for sport courts.
 5. Operational Agreement required to proceed with Project.
- In closing, we feel it is imperative to emphasize the sense of urgency of the above should we wish to place Spruce Grove on the list of Hosts.
